# **Proposed Stadium Improvements to Benefit Students and Community**



The Panther Pride Stadium Campaign Committee, a group of community volunteers, has been working tirelessly to assist the Schuylkill Valley School District in raising funds to renovate our outdated high school stadium built in 1962 with the goal of erecting a new, safe, and modern athletic facility for our students.

The value of athletics and physical education in the growth of our children cannot be underestimated. Students benefit from enhanced physical fitness and the emotional support of teammates, coaches, and mentors outside of the home and classroom. Student athletes learn accountability, self-discipline, and leadership as they in turn instill a sense of pride in the greater community. Lessons learned on the field are directly transferable to everyday life. An improved athletic facility is an investment in the future of Schuylkill Valley School District and its student body for generations to come.

Proposed stadium improvements include:

- Expansion of the track to 8 lanes, which will enable large invitationals to take place
- An all-weather surface track which will be open for community fitness use and

- provide a safer surface for all school and community events, including Special Olympics and Relay for Life
- A new digital scoreboard which will enhance opportunities for revenuegenerating sponsorships to support district and community programs and events
- An enlarged field to regulation width for soccer
- A turf surface field suitable for football, soccer, field hockey, lacrosse, PE classes, and youth sports
- A fence surround and permanent ticket booth to provide a single point of entry for all spectators as well as to guide visitors through an entrance area featuring donor recognition and custom brick payers

# National Athletic Trainers Association Safe Sports School Award


### Program recognizes high schools that help keep young athletes safe

athletic participation, we are continually working to make sure our student-athletes are as safe as possible," said Athletic Director Stephanie Deibler.



The Burlsworth award is named after Brandon Burlsworth who earned many distinctive football and academic honors before being tragically killed in a car accident 11 days after being selected to play with the Indianapolis Colts in the 1999 NFL draft. Burlsworth is the namesake of the Burlsworth Trophy, presented annually to the most outstanding Division 1 college football player who began his career as a walk-on.

### SV Alumnus Awarded Philosophy Teaching Award

Dr. Sean Riley, a member of the SV Class of 1999 and now an academic dean at the Stony Brook School, Stony Brook, NY, was recently awarded the Philosophy Learning and Teaching Organization's K-12 Philosophy Teaching Award in recognition of excellence in education. The Philosophy Learning and Teaching Organization (PLATO) advocates and supports introducing philosophy to K-12 students through programs, resource-sharing, and the development of a national network of those working in pre-college philosophy. 
