Grit as a Key to School Success

It's nothing new; we've seen it before, that stubborn refusal to quit, that determination to try again in the face of adversity. Sometimes we call it the human spirit. In the world of schooling and academia, it's known as "grit"—something Merriam-Webster defines as "mental toughness and an unyielding courage in the face of hardship."

For kids at school, we see it in the persistent struggle to figure out a math problem. We see it in a child's resolve to decode a new word or make sense of a paragraph. In athletics, we see it on the football field in that effort for a first down or on the final stretch of a 5K run.

For so many years, the idea of success in school meant being gifted with a high IQ or having an extraordinary talent. It was about the innate gifts and talents a student possessed. And while the idea of grit is recognized as an important quality, we rarely teach it directly.

Recently in a book by Paul Tough, How Children Succeed: Grit, Curiosity, and the Hidden Power of Character, Tough makes the case for perseverance, curiosity, and self-control as qualities that matter as much, if not more, than intelligence.

Similarly, Angela Duckworth at the University of Pennsylvania makes the case for grit, describing it as "perseverance and passion for long-term goals ... working strenuously toward challenges, and maintaining effort and interest over years, despite failure." Reminding me of the story of the tortoise and the hare, Duckworth describes the gritty individual as one who "approaches achievement as a marathon" and not as a sprint.

So the question becomes "How can we teach and nurture grit in children?" In this regard, Duckworth has two rules she uses with her own children. Rule #1: Everyone has a self-selected hard thing to do ... something that takes effort and deliberate practice. It might be learning to play a musical instrument or taking ballet lessons. Rule #2: You can't quit on a bad day and you can't quit in the middle. You have to stick with it until the end of the season or the end of semester.

As I think about how schools teach and nurture this sense of grit, the most obvious way is through our physical education classes, our athletic programs, and our performing arts. In the pursuit of life-long fitness and in the competition of the athletic field, we already do this work. Whether at swimming practices, on the basketball court, or at our wrestling matches, students learn the

frustrations of life beyond school. Athletes and artists learn the value of consistent preparation and face the realities of their practice on the athletic field or the performance stage.

To our performance directors, coaches, and music teachers...thank you! You are teaching our students the value of grit and persistent determination. To our parents, please insist that your child participates in at least one extracurricular activity—at school, at church, in scouting, in 4-H.

Together we can help our students and children learn the importance of sticking with something, even in the midst of adversity. We can instill the value of "grit" as one key to a lifetime of success.


In addition to Logan and Clayton, contestants included:



In Memoriam

For more than 40 years, **Bob Jones** was the voice of Schuylkill Valley football. He also served the school district as a Social Studies teacher, Social Studies department chair, assistant tournament director of Sectional Wrestling, assistant tournament director for District III Wrestling, timer and scorekeeper for boys and girls basketball, timer for boys and girls volleyball, and track & field event worker.

Mr. Jones was instrumental in the development of the first Frost Bowl, the rival football game between Schuylkill Valley and Hamburg, and actively assisted with the game

throughout the years. Mr. Jones retired at the conclusion of this year's Frost Bowl game on October 31, 2014. The press box microphone Mr. Jones used to call 40 years of games was retired and is housed in the high school trophy case.

Sadly, Mr. Jones passed away on Saturday, February 21, 2015. He was laid to rest in the Veteran's Memorial area at Schuylkill Memorial Park, Schuylkill Haven, PA.
