Faculty Recognition + Pride of SV Awards continued

On October 5, Schuylkill Valley honored the achievements of four alumni by presenting with the Pride of SV Award. The 2019 Wa Fame inductees are:

Mr. Derek Gaul – Mr. Gaul, a graduate of the class of 2011, participated in the National Honor Society, Science He was the first quarterback in Berks County history to rush for more than 3,000 career yards and led the Panthers to their second playoff appearance ever. In addition, he holds the Berks County record in the long jump with a distance of 24' 6", was a two-time PIAA State Champion in the long jump, a three-time District III long jump champion, county long jump champion and Berks County male athlete of the year in 2011. Mr. Gaul received his BS in finance from Lehigh University, where he also was a member of the football and track and field teams. He currently works in the financial planning industry.

Lt. Nathaniel Giorgio – Lt. Giorgio, also a class of 2011 graduate, received his BS in civil engineering from the United States Coast Guard Academy. At SV, he was a two-time state medalist and three-time PIAA state qualifier in wrestling. In his college career, he was a three-time NCAA Division III Wrestling All-American and four-time NCAA National Qualifier, an NCAA Division III Academic All-American, a member of the All-Navy Wrestling Team, and a Greco-Roman World Team Trial Qualifier. After graduation, he was commissioned as a US Coast Guard officer, with his first assignment working in Naval Flight Training in Pensacola, FL. He is a designated Coast Guard Aviator and MH-65D Dolphin helicopter pilot who, to date, has saved nine lives.

He received his BA in English language and literature, with honors, from Harvard University in 2007, where he was president of the Harvard Lampoon, the world-famous undergraduate comedy magazine. He has reviewed music for the online magazine Pitchfork, performed as singer and guitarist for Brooklyn-based rock band, Mr. Dream, worked as writer and music producer for the music label GODMODE, as copywriter and associate creative director for BBDO & Grey advertising agencies, and on global accounts for GE, SAP, Mobil 1, Volvo and YouTube Music.

Captain Nikki (Lykens) Yogi – Captain Yogi is an alumna of the class of 2008, where she served as president of the National Honor Society and SODAA club, and participated in concert and jazz band, student council, PYEA, Strength Club and Spanish Club. She was an All-County athlete in field hockey, a two-time District III discus champion, SV record-holder in the discus and bench press, and was named 2008 outstanding female athlete. She earned her BS in aeronautics, with a minor in homeland security, from Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University (ERAU), was commissioned as a 2nd Lieutenant in the U.S. Air Force and completed undergraduate pilot training at Vance Air Force Base (AFB). Captain Yogi flew an A-10 in support of Operation Inherent Resolve to defeat ISIS, accumulating 181 combat hours in 29 sorties. She currently has over 1,000 hours in fighter / attack / training aircraft, eighteen temporary duty assignments and eleven decorations. She remains engaged with Air Force ROTC Detachment at ERAU and has facilitated summer/winter break mentorship programs for 28 cadets over three years.

Fourth Grade Participates in Trout in the Classroom Program

SV's fourth grade students are excitedly learning about the life cycle of Pennsylvania rainbow trout through the *Trout In The Classroom* program. Partnering with Berks Watershed and Trout Unlimited, our teachers present weekly lessons in the Global Classroom where nearly 200 fish are growing in a huge tank.

Students are exposed to the lifecycle of the fish, their food, and other fun facts about their animal adaptations. They test the water for alkalinity and ammonia, add neutralizers if necessary, and monitor the temperature in the tank. The fish will be studied and enjoyed in the classroom until the spring, when students will have a hand in releasing them into a nearby stream.
