Profile of an SVSD Graduate

Welcome to the 2019-2020 school year! It is always nice to have time to refresh over the summer and to anticipate a new beginning. When thinking about new beginnings, I am reminded of Stephen Covey, the author of The 7 Habits of Highly Effective People, who wrote that one effective habit was to "begin with the end in mind." As we begin our school year, we plan for our students' outcomes and programs, and ultimately we plan for what we want our students to achieve by the end of the year.

In the larger picture of education, we should also look to begin and continue our students' education with the end of their school careers in mind. We must consider what skills, knowledge and dispositions we want an SVSD graduate to have. How do we plan so that our curricular and extracurricular programs ensure that graduates are ready for the challenges of 21st century life, work and citizenship, no matter what path they choose after high school?

To that end, we have started a process in which we examine the qualities that we, a larger school community, want our graduates to have. This project, entitled "Profile of an SVSD Graduate," will be ongoing throughout the school year.

The "Profile of a Graduate" (or similarly, the "Portrait of a Graduate") project is a nationwide endeavor that many other schools throughout the country have joined. The product from these discussions will be a tangible document that specifies cognitive, personal and interpersonal competencies that our students should have. Other schools' profiles have included qualities such as critical thinking, literacy in a variety of content areas, communication, global citizenship, judgment, decision making and many others. By prioritizing goals for teaching and learning, students, parents, faculty and staff can align their collective efforts.

We will be asking for input on this project from all of our stakeholder groups: School Board of Directors, administrators, faculty and staff, families, students and community members. You will be asked to participate in surveys and focus groups. Information regarding this process will be sent by emails or other mass communications and will be posted on the school district website at www.schuylkillvalley.org. Please refer to those sources in order to participate and provide your input on the project.




The high school Technology and Engineering Education Department was awarded an SVSD Technology Innovation Grant to assist in the development and implementation of the VEX Robotics EDR STEM Lab program as part of the high school STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) initiative. Mr. Matt **Cullen**, Technology and Engineering Education Department Chairperson, created the proposal to enhance the Design, Engineering and Robotics Tech Lab with new VEX EDR Robotics equipment. The new STEM robotics equipment and STEM Lab online curriculum will be used for Technology and Engineering/STEM courses, activity day programs, afterschool programs, community outreach programs, and the SVHS Panther Robotics team. Six VEX EDR robotics stations with new V5 wireless control system, software for coding, tools for modifications and assembly, and online curriculum and activities were purchased with the grant funding provided by the school district.

Through teamwork and collaboration with Mr. Michael Billman, Director of Instruction and Information Technology Department, Mrs. Melissa Kelchner, Director of Teaching and Learning, and Mr. Michael Mitchell, high school principal, the high school STEM initiative is moving forward to meet the needs of our students, staff, and community. The initiative will reinforce the development of 21st century skills for future success beyond our K-12 programs. The future of our students depends on what we provide and implement to meet the needs of our ever-changing local, national and global community. It is critical that we continue to focus on our STEM initiative district-wide by seeking support from our most valuable resources: local businesses, community members, families, SV Board of Directors, administration, staff and students. 2019–2020 School District Budget


In June, the Schuylkill Valley Board of Directors unanimously approved a budget of \$40,500,000 for the 2019-2020 school year. This budget includes a 0.75 mill, or 2.8%, real estate tax increase, which means that the tax on a property assessed at \$100,000 will increase \$75 to \$2,782 annually. This is the first time in five years

large part by a 10% rise in special education expenses over two years, according to Business Manager Mr. Brian D. Feick. Other cost drivers include contributions to the state teachers' retirement fund (PSERS) and increases in health insurance costs and salaries. Part of the \$638,884 shortfall that resulted in the tax increase was due to the Board's decision to eliminate the per capita tax, which accounts for \$75,749. According to Mr. Feick, the budget includes no curricular program cuts and a retirement incentive designed to prevent an increase next year.
