# **Meet Dr. Cathy Taschner, New Superintendent of Schools**

At their August 3rd meeting, the Schuylkill Valley School District announced the appointment of Dr. Cathy L. Taschner as Superintendent of Schools. Originally from Chester County, Dr. Taschner now resides in Berks County, with her husband. Dr. Taschner and her husband live on a small farmette where they have horses, sheep, goats, chickens, two dogs, and two barn cats. They hope to someday own a mini donkey, a few steers and a pig. In her free time, Dr. Taschner enjoys working in her vegetable garden, riding and teaching others how to ride horses, playing piano, cooking her grandmother's recipes, baking, and playing and watching sports. In addition, she likes to help in her brother's auto body shop, attend events at the Fulton Theatre, and host weekend dinners for family and friends.

Dr. Taschner earned her bachelor's degree in teaching at Messiah College (now Messiah University). She earned her first master's degree in health and physical education at West Chester University and earned her second master's degree and doctorate in educational leadership

from Immaculata University. In addition to holding a superintendent's letter of eligibility for the state of Pennsylvania, she recently just completed an additional two-year rigorous National Superintendent's Certification program through the AASA. (American Association of School Administrators).

Dr. Taschner began her career teaching in the Twin Valley School District. She went on to become an assistant principal before accepting the role of principal where she received the TASH award for coprincipal of the year. During that time, Dr. Taschner was appointed to the Bureau Director's Advisory Panel on Least Restrictive Environment (Gaskin's Panel) by the Governor. She served on that statewide panel and served as the chairperson of the panel and the LRE committee. Dr. Taschner also served as an assistant superintendent in several districts and a superintendent in the Coatesville Area School District. While Dr. Taschner was serving in the



Coatesville Area School District, the district won the Magna Award from the National School Boards Association and received recognition from the National Council for Teacher Quality for their work in professional learning. She also was named as Secondary Administrator of the Year by the YMWIC program, and Hometown Hero by the Chester County Futures.

Dr. Taschner says her goal is first and foremost that every student and staff continued on page 2


# 2021–2022 School District Budget

In June, the Schuylkill Valley Board of Directors unanimously approved a budget of \$41,680,075, without increasing taxes, for the 2021-2022 school year. The budget includes no curricular

program cuts and 0% increase for health insurance costs. The cost drivers include contributions to the state teachers' retirement fund (PSERS) and increases in salaries.

As a result of the distribution of state gaming funds through Act 1 of 2006, school property taxes were reduced by \$156.93 this year for all property owners who qualified as homesteads and/or farmsteads. The annual tax bill for a property assessed at \$100,000 remains at 27.82 mills, or \$2,782.

The 2021-2022 budget has total expenditures of \$41,680,075, which is an increase of \$821,431 or 2% over 2020-2021 expenditures.

# **Meet Dr. Janet C. Heilman, New Assistant Superintendent of Schools**

Changing roles this year is **Dr. Janet G. Heilman**, former acting superintendent and director of pupil services and learning, who has been hired as the district's new assistant superintendent. Originally from Muhlenberg Township, Dr. Heilman now resides in Brecknock Township with her husband of 27 years, Dave. Dr. Heilman has two sons, a stepson, a stepdaughter, and six grandchildren ranging from three to 12 years old. Dr. Heilman earned her associate's degree in early childhood management at Reading Area Community College. She earned her bachelor's degree in elementary education as well as her master's in educational leadership at Alvernia University. She has a Ph.D. from Capella University in leadership in educational administration. Dr. Heilman started her career in the Reading School District where she taught in elementary for nine years, mostly as a second grade teacher. She then accepted the position of assistant principal for three years before ending her tenure as an elementary school principal for five years. Dr. Heilman served as the principal of East Elementary School in the Conrad Weiser School District for seven years before coming to Schuylkill Valley in January 2020. While at Schuylkill Valley, Dr. Heilman has served as the director of teaching and learning, director of pupil services, as well as the acting superintendent since May of 2021. During her time as a principal, Dr. Heilman created and implemented the Reading Marathon Challenge. This gave students an opportunity to challenge themselves to read independently and with their families. Students were challenged to read a certain number of books or minutes to qualify as a "finisher." This program was nationally recognized by HLN and runDisney. Dr. Heilman ran this program in three different elementary schools over the course of nine years.



He said that Mr. Yoder, health and physical education teacher, knew that he was interested in lifting weights, and that he gave the students a chance to learn how to lift weights correctly.

"Over the course of my SV career, Mr. Yoder challenged me to keep getting better and to learn more about all kinds of fitness competition avenues," says Horning.

The two have kept in touch for the last 21 years, and Jed comes back to SV to help the lifting club whenever he is given the opportunity.

At age 35, Jed decided to enter his first bodybuilding competition in Baltimore, Maryland. He came in second place, and then knew it was time to hire a coach to take things to the next level. He hired coach Dave "Jumbo" Palumbo to help focus his progress, which ultimately led him to winning the Pennsylvania state championship in June 2021.

Jed traveled to Pittsburgh to compete in the International Federation of Bodybuilding and Fitness Pro Master National Championships on July 21-24, 2021. He got 3rd place in the Heavyweight Class which automatically qualifies him for National competitions through 2022 where he will continue his pursuit of pro status.

Jed says that he will not be competing again until 2022 and will continue to work on his craft. When asked what he is looking forward to the most after his competition in Pittsburgh, he says "I look forward to my son's soccer season... and a family vacation. I'd really like some cheesecake too."
